

Houses and Homes



Communication and Language	To use sound buttons and voice recorders and to share their understanding and thoughts. Talking about the kind of houses we live in and our experience of our walk on houses and homes. To orally retell stories – ‘The three little pigs’ and ‘Hansel and Gretel’.
Physical Development	Games – Children will engage in a variety of activities to prepare for the sports day activities. Children will engage in activities both indoors and outdoors to improve their fine and gross motor skills. Children will also be encouraged to write every day.
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	We will be discussing British values during our PSHE lessons. We will also talk about lying, right and wrong and discussing what the wolf needs to say to the pigs (apologising). We will be talking about what the expectations are for Year 1 and we will be visiting year 1 classes to meet our new teachers and getting ready to move on (transition).
Literacy	Children will be revising and consolidating phonics phases 2-4. We will be practising blending, and segmenting and encouraging the children to continue applying these skills in reading and writing. We will read stories based on houses and homes such as ‘The Three Little Pigs’ and ‘Hansel and Gretel’. Children will be continuing to practise their reading and writing skills.
Mathematics	We will learn about odd and even numbers, patterns, symmetry, counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We will also be learning about one more and one less than a given number, capacity and 2D and 3D shapes.
Understanding the World	Children will be learning about what materials houses are made of, such as bricks, concrete and glass (windows). We will also compare Houses and Homes around the world. We will learn about Islam.
Expressive Arts and Design	We will be learning songs to put up a splendid performance during our end of year assembly. We will also build different houses using a variety of materials.
