Dear Parents/Carers,

During the Spring 2 term, we will have many focus areas in English and Maths. In Maths we will be focusing on fractions, decimals and percentages as well as volume and statistics. In English, our writing (character description, narratives and non-chronological reports) will be based on a fictional story called "Eye of the Wolf" which is set in Africa, linking to our Geography unit.
