



Reception Summer 1



Communication and Language	Children will become confident in talking about specified subjects and giving relevant facts. This term they will also engage in fiction and nonfiction stories and begin to describe habitats
Physical Development	In PE lessons, children will be learning a variety of ball skills and games. Children will develop skills necessary to work collaboratively when playing team games or competing in team sports. We will continue to ensure that we are using a pencil effectively to form recognisable letters, most of which are formed correctly.
Literacy	We will continue to be developing the children's independent writing skills, encouraging them to orally compose and then write sentences with increased confidence and accuracy, using their phonics to support. Children will also become confident in identifying sounds, including phonemes and other digraphs on a sound mat. We will be listening to stories and is beginning to anticipate what may happen next.
Mathematics	Children will revisit and consolidate their knowledge of ordinal numbers as well as number bonds. They will also learn to find one more and one less than a given number using a number line. We will be continuing to encourage subitising with numbers to encourage children to become familiar with number patterns. We will also begin to look at telling the time of o'clock on an analogue clock.
Understanding the World	This term we will continue to learn about and sort healthy/unhealthy foods as well as identify and group a range of fruits and vegetables. We will begin to learn about life cycles of plants and animals and learn what they need to survive. Alongside this we will explore a range of habitats, looking at why the animal lives like that.
Expressive Arts and Design	This term we will be using what they have learnt about media and materials in an original way and be able to explain our choices. Children will be selecting appropriate resources and adapting work where necessary. In Music we will be moving along to the beat of familiar songs.
